Membership Requirements and Purpose Statement

AAJ Regular, Life, President's Club, or Sustaining Members may join the Hernia Mesh Litigation Group if the applicant affirms those requirements set forth in the Hernia Mesh Litigation Group Membership Affidavit. AAJ Paralegal Affiliates may join after filling out the application and being vetted, but only if an AAJ Regular, Sustaining, Life, President's Club, or Leaders Forum member from the same firm is also a member of the Litigation Group.¹
